WHO ARE OARSOME CHANCE?

Oarsome Chance is a registered charity offering an Alternative Education Provision which supports students from across Hampshire.

Oarsome Chance’s model doesn’t focus on just one activity but a range. The breadth of activities is purposeful to enable students to gain a range of experiences enabling them to best understand their strengths and interests and identify new skills and opportunities.

Oarsome Chance’s trauma informed programme blends a range of vocational learning alongside wellbeing support and focuses on individuals, to give students the best chance to achieve.

WHAT IS ‘OARSOME PATHWAYS’?

A Post 16 provision for young people who are not ready at the end of Year 11 to manage a large-scale college environment.

A one to two year programme, based at our Havant site, to empower young people with the skills, knowledge and confidence to access further education, training and/or employment opportunities.

CENTRED AROUND FOUR KEY THREADS:

PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT

- Groupwork and 1:1 sessions aimed at developing the skills, self-confidence and self-belief needed to make the next steps into further education or the workplace.

VOCATIONAL TRAINING

A programme of Occupational Studies for the Workplace providing the opportunity to experience areas such as carpentry, plumbing, motor vehicle and cycle maintenance, sport, cooking and music, alongside Functional Skills Maths and English sessions.

CAREER PATHWAYS

Students explore work settings and career opportunities via workplace visits across a range of industries, developing an understanding of working life. Where appropriate, we aim to support young people into work experience placements.

ENRICHMENT

Offsite visits and outdoor activities that build confidence and transferable teamwork skills, including sailing, rowing, rock climbing, paddle sports, mountain biking, orienteering, fishing and residentials. There will also be the opportunity to achieve a range of national governing body qualifications alongside these activities.
